

Benjamin Crowley to Thomas W. Crowley Jr. Deed

Where all now by these presents that I Benjamin Crowley
of the State and District above named, in consideration of one hundred and fifty dollars to
one in hand paid by Thomas W. Crowley of the District aforesaid have granted, bargained, sold
and released, and by these presents do do grant, bargain, sell ~~and release~~ unto the said Thomas
W. Crowley, part of that tract of Land by the name of Farmers Berry lying on the Great Eocene
Containing one hundred and fifty acres more or less, Situated and lying in the District of
Chesterfield, beginning at the fork of the Eocene and running to the North west prong to the
the back line, the which is the dividing line between Thomas W. Crowley and Elisa and
Caroline Crowley, then with said back line to the Thirty land, thence with said line to the
head of the Wing Branch, from thence to the beginning containing one hundred and fifty acres
more or less, together with all and singular the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances
to the same belonging or in any wise incidental or appertaining to have and to hold all
and singular the premises above mentioned unto the said Thomas W. Crowley his heirs
and assigns forever, and I do hereby bind myself, my heirs, executors and administrators
to warrant and forever defend the said premises unto the Thomas W. Crowley his heirs
and assigns forever, and my heirs and every other person lawfully claiming or any part
thereof. Witness my hand and seal the February the 15 day in the year of our Lord
one thousand Eight hundred and Sixty eight and in the ninety third of the independence
of the United States.
